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About Ray Villafane

In 2003, Ray Villafane began to pursue a career as a commercial sculptor. Within a couple of years, he had transitioned from a school teacher to a full-time commercial sculptor with clients such as Warner Bros. / DC Comics, Marvel and McFarlane Toys. As Ray started to dive deeper into sculpting, his pumpkin carvings began to come alive with character. Images of them and his process went viral,

catching the attention of many people, including some at the Food Network. In 2008 Ray contributed to the launching of a series of successful pumpkin carving shows with the network. Over a decade later, the success of this genre of shows has continued to thrive.

As the pumpkin carving gained momentum, Ray began to focus his attention on events. He found himself exploring a wide range of unconventional mediums such as sand, sticks, rocks and recycled materials. These various ingredients would eventually come together in the creation of a magical world of whimsical characters and clever storytelling. Each fall Ray has gathered a small team of artists to help build an immersive, one-of-a-kind experience with its roots in pumpkin carving, scarecrows and more. Ray's works have been on display throughout the world. He has carved at the White House, Heidi Klum's annual Halloween party, Ocean Park Hong Kong and many more. He holds two Guinness Book World Records and has also been recognized by Ripley's Believe It or Not.
