One Drop of Love performance to explore concept of race February 5



Mesa, **AZ** – *One Drop of Love*, a dynamic multimedia solo performance exploring how race has been constructed in the United States, will be performed live in Mesa Arts Center's Nesbitt/Elliott Playhouse on February 5 at 7:30 p.m. Tickets are available through the Mesa Arts Center Box Office at MesaArtsCenter.com or by calling 480-644-6500.

Produced by Ben Affleck, Matt Damon and the show's writer/performer Fanshen Cox DiGiovanni, *One Drop of Love* will explore family, race, love, pain – and a path towards reconciliation. The performance incorporates

filmed images, photographs and animation to tell the story of how the notion of 'race' influences Cox DiGiovanni's relationship with her father – a journey that will take the audience from the 1700s to the present, to cities all over the U.S. and to West and East Africa, where both father and daughter spent time in search of their 'racial' roots.

"...It often frustrated me that 'race' was such a strong influence in my life. I wanted to explore what was behind this influence – was I making more of it than it was; or was the real issue that others needed to see how much it influences THEM?" –Fanshen Cox DiGiovanni. DiGiovanni's ultimate goal of the show is to encourage everyone to discuss 'race' openly and critically.

Through Mesa Arts Center's Engagement Programs, a day time performance for students in grades 7 through 12 will also be offered.
