Artwork donations are being accepted through Friday, Oct. 25. Artists 18+ are invited to submit artwork in any medium, not exceeding 24 x 24 x 24 inches. Wall objects must be ready to hang. Following this event, BidUP will take a hiatus in 2020, while the Museum re-evaluates the format.
